

MACKINAW TOWNSHIP REGULAR BOARD MEETING MAY 16, 2017

Supervisor Crisp called the Regular Board Meeting to order at 5 PM with the pledge to the flag.
All Board members present by roll call: Falor, Closs, Crisp, Brew, Munns.
Also present: Eleanor Crisp, Assessor Joe Lavender, and Attorney Tim MacArthur.
The Agenda was accepted as presented. The minutes from April 18, 2017 meeting stand as presented.

Reports

- Attorney MacArthur is crediting the township docket \$585 in addition to the original \$500 retainer for a total credit of \$1,085 for legal services for the 2017-2018 fiscal year.
For townships that choose not to allow any medical marijuana operations, there is an option of passing a resolution publicly declaring the townships opposition to such facilities within their boundaries. This will be reviewed at next month's meeting.
- Assessor Lavender is attending seminars to meet his continuing education requirements. The next Board of Review meeting is July 18 at 3:30 pm.
- Supervisor Crisp has contacted the county to schedule road brining. Crisp reviewed correspondence from the Michigan Public Service Commission regarding an avenue for video/cable television dispute resolutions.

New Business

- Motion by Falor, supported by Closs to reappoint Robin Nelson to two-year term as the township Library board representative. Roll call vote: Ayes: Falor, Crisp, Brew, Closs, Munns. Nays: None. Motion carried.
- Motion by Falor, supported by Brew to purchase four calendars plus advertising from the Mackinaw City Band Boosters. Roll call vote: Ayes: Brew, Crisp, Closs, Falor, Munns. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Treasurers Report/Warrant List/ Financial Report

- The Treasurers report for April was accepted as presented. Falor is in the process of collecting delinquent personal property taxes.
- Motion by Brew, supported by Falor to approve the Warrant list for May.
Roll call vote: Ayes: Closs, Falor, Munns, Brew, Crisp. Nays: None. Motion carried.
- The Standard budget financial report for May was reviewed and accepted as presented.
\$41,961.41 has been paid to the Village for the annual fire protection services.
